Rock Island nabs federal reading grant

Reading educational efforts in three of Rock Island's elementary schools received a boost Friday with a federal grant of about \$300,000, part of the \$11 million No Child Left Behind Reading First program.

Jay Marino, the district's assistant superintendent for instruction and school improvement, said about \$100,000 will go to each of three elementary schools: Lincoln, Hawthorne-Irving and Grant.

Seventeen Illinois districts

received the grants, which went to schools on the Academic Watch List. The money will help classroom reading programs in pre-kindergarten through third grades, and is part of the No Child Left Behind legislation enacted in 2001.

He said Rock Island will hire a reading coach for the schools. The coach will work with teachers to refine instructional skills in teaching reading. The funds also will go to afterschool professional development of teachers, and there is money for reading textbooks and materials.
